Q. How many Executive orders have been issued by Presidents of the United States? H. E. A. There are about 10,000 Executive orders bearing serial numbers and about the same number not so designated.

Q. In what year was the limitation on nickels and pennies as legal tender removed? S. O. M. A. In 1933. Until that year minor coins, i.e., cents and nickels, were legal tender up to 25 cents in any one payment.

Q. How many people are needed to play a game of auction pinochle? S. A. A. Auction pinochle is a three-handed game which is considered best when played by four players. There are three active players in each deal; if four play, the dealer gives no cards to himself. Five players make a "full table" and in this case the dealer also gives no cards to the second player on his left.

Q. What was the age limit placed by Napoleon upon his generals? E. Y. A. Napoleon expressed the opinion that no general over 45 years of age should be allotted an active command in the field and that no general over 60 should be given any but an honorary appointment.

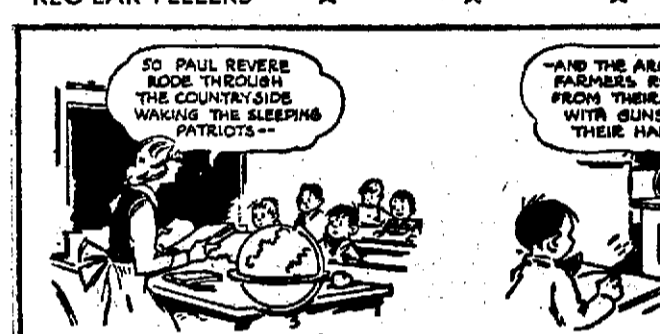
