Q. Has Joe Louis ever been matched for a 20-round bout with Bob Pastor, or any other opponent of his class? E. S.
A. Nat Fleischer, boxing authority, says that Joe Louis and Bob Pastor were listed for a 20-round fight in Detroit. Joe Louis knocked out Bob Pastor in the 11th round. This was the only time Joe Louis has been listed for a 20-round fight to date.

Q. Does one large electric bulb give as much light as several small ones of the same total wattage? B. D. A.
A. It is more efficient to use one large bulb than to use several small ones of the same total wattage. For instance, it takes the light output of six 25-watt bulbs to equal the light of one 100-watt bulb.

Q. What was the first guidebook published by Baedeker? M. M.
A. The first of Karl Baedeker's books was a guide to Coblenz, published in 1829. This was followed by travel books on most of the European countries, the Orient and North America. They were printed in German, French and English.

Q. Why are cakes made with buttermilk or sour milk usually lighter than those made with sweet milk? P. L. B.
A. This is because the lactic acid in these milks softens the gluten that part of the flour which causes toughness in baked products.

Q. When was the ballet school founded in Russia? R. T. N.
A. The Russian Imperial School of Ballet was founded about 1735 and soon achieved supremacy. After a period of decline it was revived by Michel Fokine. The Russian government furthered and assisted the ballet.

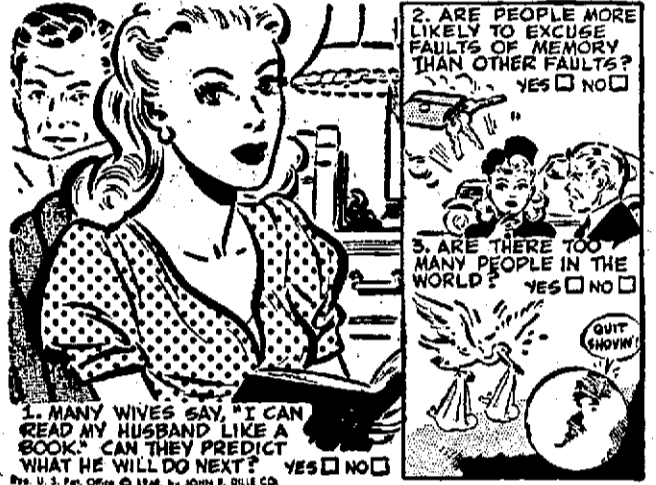
Q. Do fungi produce seeds? S. C.

What they are sooner or later, slavery or freedom will face a decision as to who will rule the world.

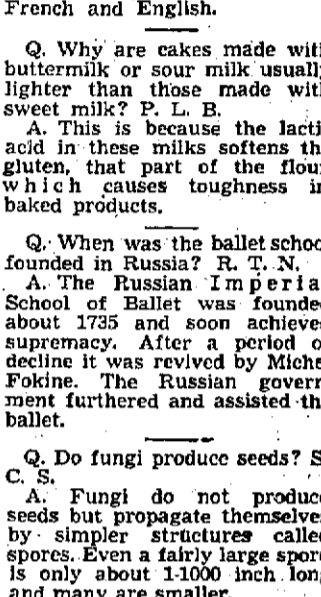
Every single worker in Scandinavia ought to know with scorching certainty that the workers will lose their freedom under Communist dictatorship.
