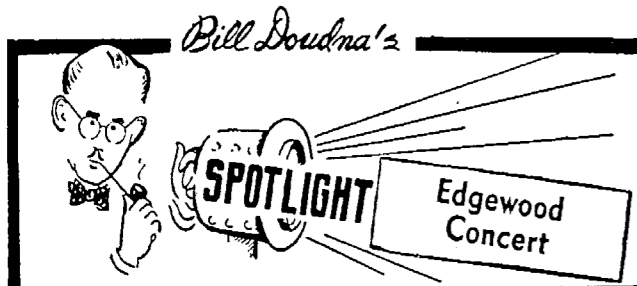

The Madison Kiwanis club announced today a special program for the ladies night banquet to be held at the Park hotel Monday at 6:30 p. m.

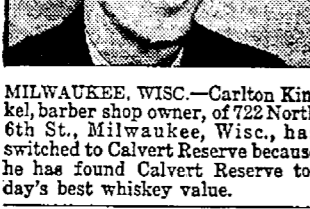

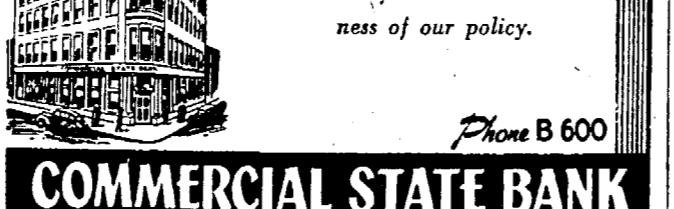
