"How is it that 70 per cent of Chicago's delinquency comes from our slum sections, which houses 10 to 15 per cent at the most of our population?" Park asked. "It isn't bad parents, It isn't background. It's emotional and social maladjustment that causes delingency, which in turn is caused by society itself."
