Q. What are the family allowances for student veterans under the new law? J. E. H.

A. The new law raised the subsistence allowances of veterans taking full-time courses in schools, colleges and universities. The new payments will be. at the monthly rate of \$75 for a veteran without dependents, \$105 for a veteran with one dependent, and \$120 for a veteran with more than one dependent. The new schedules are effective on April 1, and veterans will receive their first checks at the higher rates on or shortly after May 1.

Q Is any known substance harder than the diamond? F. K. A. No such substance is known. All the conventional methods of determining hard-ness reveal that the diamond is harder than any of the elements thus far produced in sufficient quantity and form to make a hardness measurement.


