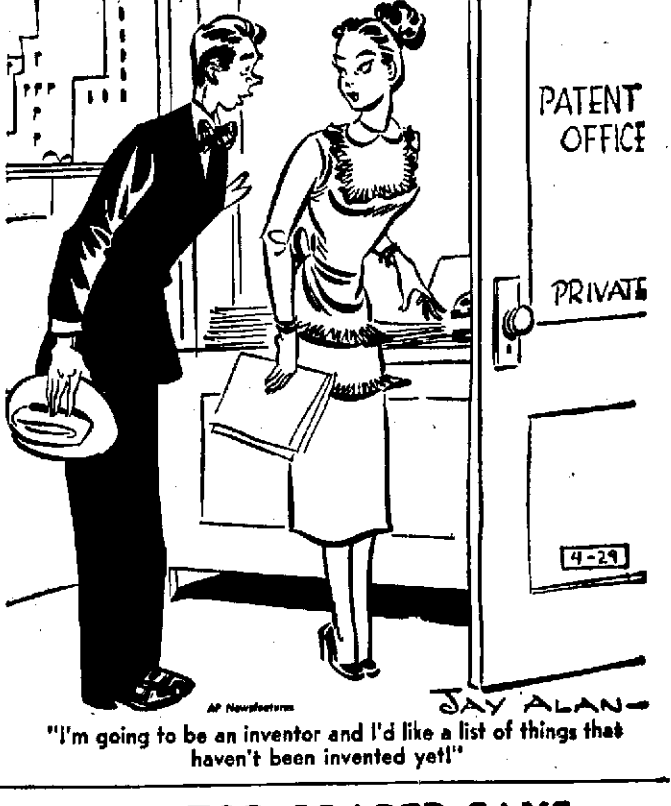

McKENNEY ON BRIDGE

South West North East 1 Pass 1 Pass 2 Pass 4 Pass 29 For today's lesson hand we have a hand that came up in the recent Eastern States tournament in New York. Peter Leventritt was the only player in the room to make the contract of four spades. The play involved is a safety which I think has appeared in every book written on the play of the hand. The question is how to play the spade suit. Declarer has to lose one club and one diamond, and the must avoid losing more than one spade. The correct play is to lead a small spade from dummy and go up with the king, then lead a small spade back toward the ace. If East plays low, declarer must put on the seven-spot from dummy. If East covers with the nine, declarer wins with the ace. With this play East can make only one spade trick. Every expert admits that this is the way the hand must be played at rubber bridge because there the contract is the important thing. A discussion arose, however, about this play in tournament bridge, in which you have to play for the maximum number of tricks. Therefore some of the experts think that in tournament play you should try to pick up the whole spade suit, and that the only way to do that is to lead the ace of spades and then finesse the jack. I do not go along with this theory because in my opinion bidding and making four spades on this hand is bound to produce a score above average. Therefore I think tournament players as well as rubber bridge players should make the safety play on this hand.

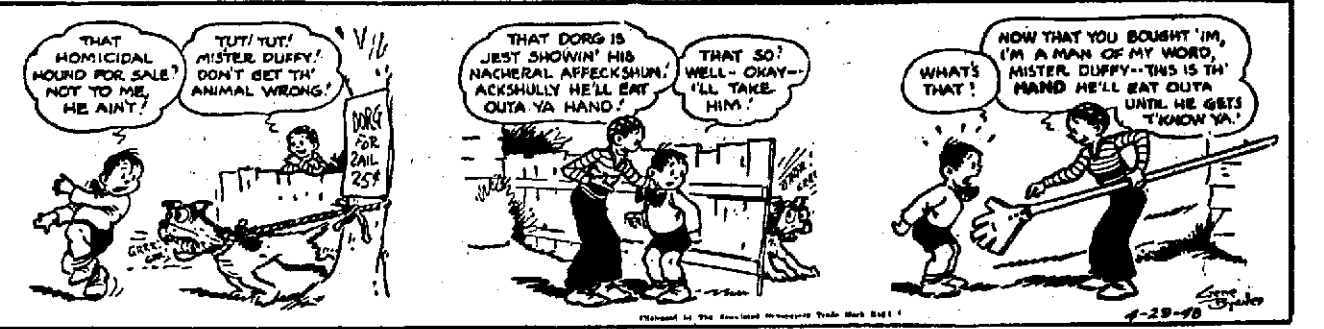

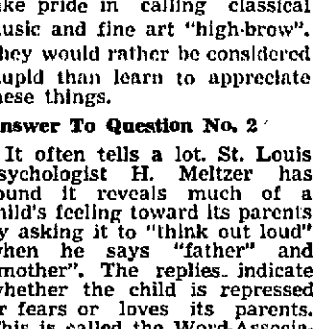
