N. G. T. A. When the age of clipper ships began to fall off after reaching its peak in the 1850's, McKay evolved the medium copper, less speedy but with increased stowage space. During the Civil War he built monitors and fighting sloops, and even a few screw-driven steamships. He died in 1880.

Are the Diesel engines used by the Pennsylvania Railroad powered by oil or electricity?

W. A. G. A. The Association of American Railroads says that main line Diesel locomotives of the Pennsylvania Railroad combine both oil and electric power. In fact, the name "Diesel" carries the connotation of oil power to which is generally added the word "electric" forming the term "Diesel-electric" which means motive power transmitted from an oil-fired internal combustion engine to an electrical generator which in turn supplies the power to turn the traction motors.
