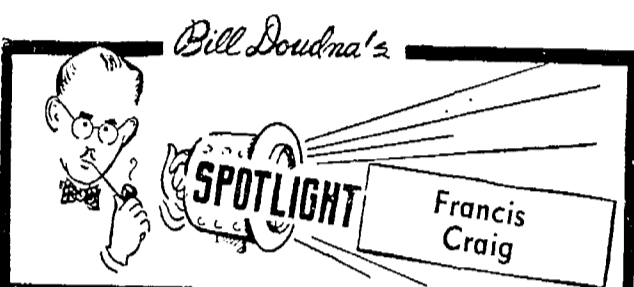

Former Policeman Gets 25 Years for Murder

ROCKFORD, Ill. (AP)—John A. Provancher, former Rockford police detective, was sentenced Monday to 25 years for the murder of Andrew Sorenson. The mandatory sentence was imposed formally by Circuit Judge William R. Dusher, who told Provancher: "Johnny, I'm sorry you got into this situation." In a formal statement to the court, Provancher said: "As God is my judge, I did not kill Andrew Sorenson. Sorenson, a Chesham, Ill., tavern-keeper, was murdered last January for the \$700 in his till. Provancher, a liquor salesman, had been charged with embezzling money from his employer. The state charged he robbed Sorenson to get the money to make restitution on the embezzlement charge. He will be taken to Joliet to begin serving his term later this week.
