Sugar Maple Pupils' Choice for State Tree

Wisconsin school children have picked the sugar maple for the official state tree.

William T. Calhoun, chairman of the state centennial tree committee, announced today that the sugar maple won a school children's poll for an official state tree by a wide margin.

The sugar maple polled 87,253 votes, against 17,310 for the run-runner, the white pine. Other votes were: birch, 41,896; white elm, 37,421; Norway pine, 22,597; shagbark hickory, 8,712; and hemlock, 7,693.

Calhoun said a resolution will be introduced in the 1949 legislature to give the sugar maple official status. In previous years the school children picked the violet for the official state flower and the robin for the state bird.
