A. Food remains in the stomach from one to six hours and sometimes longer, depending upon the nature of the food and the quantity consumed.

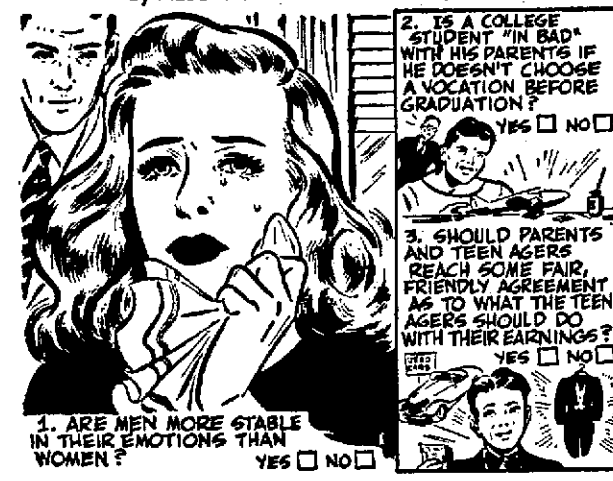
Q. In lumbering, why are the tops of the tall trees cut off first, before the trees are felled? P. R.
