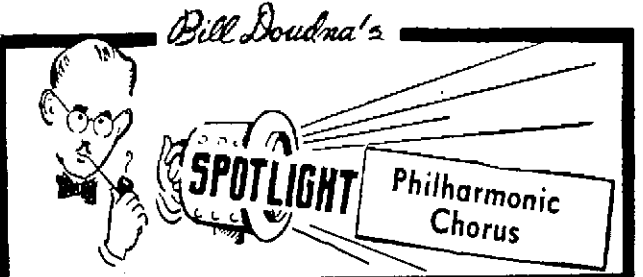

A singing group trained to meet the demands of modern rhythms and harmonies sang Saturday night at West high school. It was the Philharmonic chorus of Madison, directed by Dr. Bjornar Bergeth.

The chorus showed the results of demanding direction and close study of the seldom-heard music it had chosen.

Among its best efforts was "Old Joe Has Gone Fishing," from Benjamin Britten's opera, "Peter Grimes," produced in the U. S. for the first time this season.

Other new music included "Madrigal for a Bright Morning," Barlow (dedicated by the composer to William Schempf of Madison); "Where Corals Lie," Read, and two songs by Castelnovo-Tedesco.

The program opened with older songs—"Now Start We With a Goodly Song," "Nymphs and Shepherds," and "L'Allegro." It also included folk music and Howard Hanson's ringing "Maypole Dance." Throughout, the emphasis was on shading, tempo, and interplay of men's and women's voices, although once or twice there were splendid mass efforts.

Mrs. Robert Wilson and Mrs. Richard Heine were the soloists, in each case introducing a number picked up by the chorus.

Both sang with pleasant voice and clear enunciation. "The Harn of Harmony," trio directed by Margaret Rupp Cooper, were assisting artists. They not only played expertly but showed the audience that harps are capable of more than the arpeggios to which most orchestral works limit them. Carole Branley introduced the numbers.

If there was an individual star on the program, it was Julia Benoy Landmark, the accompanist. Her work in the modern music was something for her to be proud of.
