


McKENNEY By Jay Alan ON BRIDGE

By WILLIAM E. MCKENNEY Gerald S. Nagler, young, promising publicity man of New York City, says there is a great deal of confusion in the minds of beginners at bridge concerning the one no trump response. If your partner makes an opening bid, and you have noth-

ing, the correct thing to do is. pass. However, if you have as much as a trick, you probably should make a response of some kind, and the weakest of all responses

is one no trump. To raise your partner to two of his suit shows a little strong. er hand than one no trump. For this you should have nearly normal trump support and at least a side king.

You should not show a new suit at the two level unless you



Therefore, the proper response is one no trump. South has a very good hand with a six-card suit, but knowing that his part-ner does not have a good hand, he hide two snades he bids two spades.

West opens the jack of dia-monds, but South cannot be prevented from making two spades. He must either make a heart trick or get a discard of a heart on the king of clubs. Thus, he loses two hearts, two diamonds and a club.
