Methodist Conference Hits Draft, Conscripton Tuesdaytime
GREEN BAY—(U.P.)—Wisconsin Methodists were on record today against peacetime military conscription because it "makes force a basis of our foreign policy."

Delegates at the 102nd annual Wisconsin conference also opposed selective service as a "departure from American tradition," and looked with disfavor on "infiltration of military men into key positions in the government."

Delegates fixed salaries for executive ministers. The basic salary for a minister with a family was set at \$2,000 a year, while the salaries for single ministers and student ministers were fixed at \$1,500.
