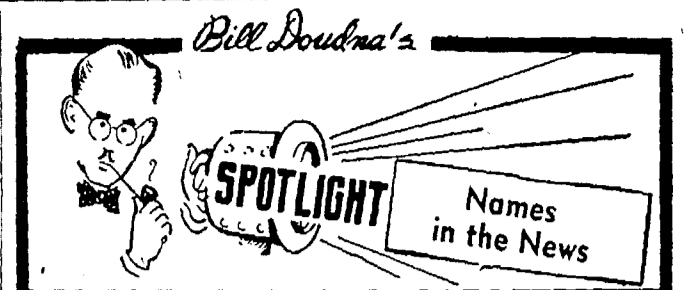
Frances Fonda moves the whole kit and kaboodle of her home to Connecticut June 5—to join Henry in the east for at least a year.
