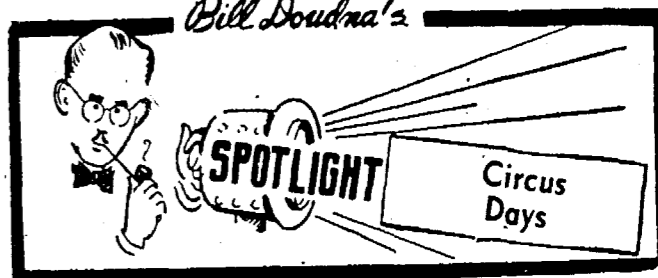

Braathen described the new spot as an "ideal" location for a circus. From Madison, the Cole show will go to Delavan. That city is a small one for a large show, but this will be a sentimental visit. Delavan, home of W. C. Coup, once was the circus capital of the nation, with several shows wintering there. And since this is Wisconsin's centennial year, the Cole management decided to visit circusdom's "old home town" in honor of the event.

While no definite date has been set, the Ringling Brothers-Barnum and Bailey circus probably will play Madison about 10 days after the Cole date. The "big one" will be in Detroit July 16, 17, and 18, then will start a westward trek with stops in South Bend, Milwaukee, and Madison. It is scheduled to open an eight-day run in Hollywood on Sept. 4 with a typical filmland premiere. The opener will be a hospital benefit with Kay Kyser in charge. Seats for that show will run as high as \$100 each, with proceeds going to the St. John's Hospital fund.
