ANSWERS TO Modest Maidens

Q. What is the per capita consumption of petroleum? B. B.

A. In 1947 the per capita con-sumption of petroleum products in the United States was 580 llons a year as compared with 36 36 36 gallons a year in 1900, ac-cording to the American Petro-leum Institute. Before World War, II the average for the world was 37 gallons per capita per year.

Q. Do storks ever build their nests in trees? N. R. T. $_{\bullet}$ A. Practically all storks have deserted their former nesting places in trees and on cliffs to build on the roofs of dwellings, In winter, the European stork migrates to Africa.

Q. Is it advisable to use a DDT spray to protect clothes in a closet from moths? C. R. P. A. Spraying with DDT is sug-gested by the Department of Agriculture. An oil spray pref-erably should be applied to walls, woodwork, baseboard and shelves. It should be a residual spray rather than one of the so-called aerosol bombs. DDT solutions, lightly applied, do not in-jure woolen clothing.






