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



Q. Is the Prince Albert tobac co named for a person? L. K. A. The name "Prince Albert" was decided upon for smoking tobacco because at the time the process for it was patented a coat of the same name was popular with a number of persons in public life. While it is generally agreed that the coat was named for Albert, Prince of Wales, afterwards King Edward VII who were this type of coat when he visited the United States in 1860, some relate it to Albert, Consort of Queen Victoria.

Q. Does a snake ever pursue a man and attack him? R. V. A. The bushmaster, a member of the rattlesnake family, is the largest and most venomous American snake, sometimes reaching a length of 12 feet. It is the only snake of this country known to pursue human beings, following its attack with a series of vicious lunges of its long fangs.

Q. What causes the ridges in the bark of a tree L. T. T.

A. A tree grows in height at the top and in circumference in the cambium layer of the trunk. As the girth increases the bark splits into vertical lines, producing the familiar ridges.

Q. How is the amount of compensation for a disabled veteran determined? R. McK.

A. The amount of compen-A. The amount of compen-sation depends on the extent of the disability. This is called the "degree of disability." It is de-cided by a Rating Board in ac-cordance with established schedules. This board "rates" the disability in percentages from 0 to 100 per cent. Thirteen dol-lars and eighty cents a month is allowed for each 10 per cent of disability but no compen-sation is paid for disabilities rated less than 10 per cent in degree.



Frank Weisbach, of Cincinnati, who with Allen Harvey of Louisville, Ky., won the world championship masters pair event last summer, was the vic-tim of the situation. In dupli-cate bridge the hands are dealt out on the first round and placed in duplicate boards. What happened here was that North, West and South players took their cards from board No. 1, while Weisbach in the East took his by mistake from board No.

When the dummy went down, Weisbach saw that South had the jack of hearts, then 10 of diamonds and seven of clubs, which he had in his own hand. Of course, he called the tournament director for a ruling.

Weisbach explained the bid-



The director correctly informed him that he would have to put his hand back in board No. 2 and take the correct hand from board No. 1 and that he was responsible for all of the bids he had made. He would have to play it out with the correct cards. cards.

hand, which was as follows: Spades, ace, 8; Hearts, queen, 6, 4, 2; Diamonds, ace, king, 6; Clubs, 9, 8, 6, 4. With his new hand Weisbach

cashed the king and ace of dia-monds and led the third round of diamonds, which his partner won with the queen. And there was no way that declarer could stop him from getting a heart trick and the ace of spades— down two doubled and redoubled for a lone top.


