

McKENNEY ON BRIDGE

IMMEDIATELY after the re-I cent party in Pittsburgh, Pa., for the Children's Cancer Fund, my old "ticker" started to act up and I found myself in the hospital there. Good care and the friendly calls of many congenial people soon had me up on my feet again. One of my most faithful callers was Reginald A.

Daniell gave me the idea for today's hand when he remarked, "My friends complain that I bid too much and make too few."
That could happen on today's hand very easily. I do not think that seven spades is too much to bid with this hand. Our lesson has to do with the correct line of play.

A beginner would be inclined

A beginner would be inclined to win the opening lead of the queen of clubs with dummy's



ace, figuring on cross-ruffing clubs and diamonds. All we have to do is to take 13 tricks, and that can be done easily if we take a good look at the

dummy.

Isn't there a way to set the dummy up? There are only three outstanding trumps, and they can be picked up with dummy's trumps. So let's set up the trumps at the same time.

Play the deuce of clubs from dummy on the first trick and trump it in the South hand with the queen of spades. Lead the three of spades, win the dummy with the nine-spot. Then lead the four of clubs and trump it with the ace of spades.

Go back over to dummy by leading the five of spades, ruff the seven of clubs with the seven of spades, then lead the eight of spades. This will be won in dummy with the jack and will pick up West's last trump. Now lead a small heart from dummy to the king, lead back the queen of hearts, overtake it with the ace, and all of dummy's tricks are good. dummy's tricks are good.
