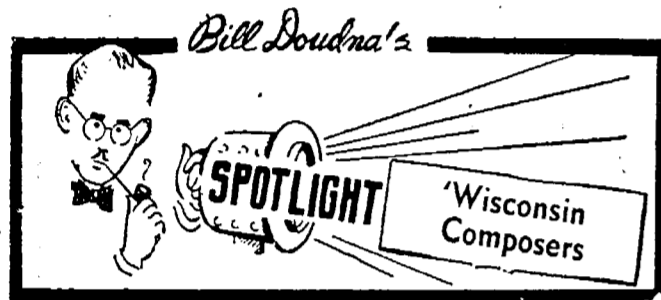


Success Story
