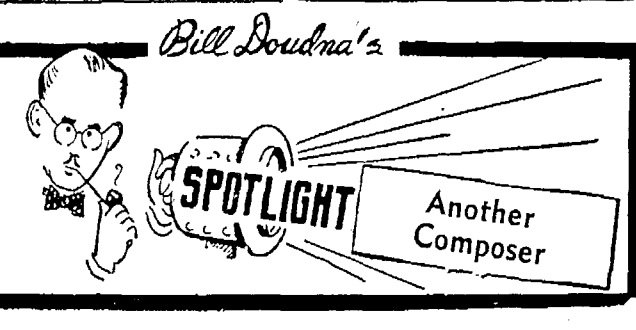

Let us have one starting omission and shows some evidence that a little more research was needed. The brochure contains one section listing composers on whom information is incomplete. In several cases, this information could easily have been obtained. For example, the names of Burchell A. Allen, Lillian Nelding Dress, Frank P. Fossage, Nathan Grablin, R. R. Grindie, W. W. Heitz, R. W. Hurd, and others are followed by the notation that their works were published by the Ward-Brook Music Co. Certainly some information could have been obtained there; and a Madison city directory would have supplied, some, too. It was a surprise, too, to find in this list the name of Vera Warden Dougan. Mrs. Dougan is the president of the organization which published the book. She even wrote its foreword! But more startling than that was the omission of Woody Herman. This name appears in the "ASCAP Biographical Dictionary," cross-indexed as a Wisconsin native in the geographical section. Besides composing such a popular song as "Apple Honey," Herman wrote a teaching folio for clarinet. Herman will be in Madison on Thursday, July 8, when he will bring his orchestra to the Capitol theater for a one-day engagement. Featured soloist will be Mary Ann McCall. The Capitol has also booked a high-ranking comedy act for Friday, July 16. It's the Three Stooges, "America's buffoonery kings," whom you've undoubtedly seen on the screen and heard on the air.

Joel McCrea, "just a cowboy," will clear close to a half million as a result of the percentage he owns in "Ramrod" and "Four Faces West."

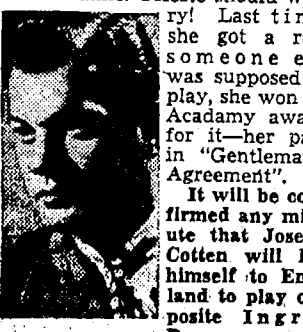
