Editor Questions U. S. Saving Role

Methodist Meeting Hears Hutchinson
Today we are working under the assumption that America can save the world, Dr. Paul Hutchinson, Chicago, editor of the Christian Century, said Wednesday night, speaking in First-University Methodist church at a public service of the 94th session of the West Wisconsin Conference of the Methodist church.
"But," asked Dr. Hutchinson, "does America have the political wisdom, the economic wisdom, or the human wisdom to make such a plan workable?"
Speaking of three popular assumptions, he questioned whether Protestantism could supply the spiritual needs of modern man. The emphasis of Protestantism today is rationalism, he said. For the mass of the people, the mood isn't for rational thinking—they are thinking in terms of security and shelter, he added.
Dr. Hutchinson questioned the advisability of the Ecumenical movement. Directed toward organizing all Christian non-Roman Catholic churches into a world council of churches, the Ecumenical movement is to be acted upon in Amsterdam in August.
"Protestantism needs its many divisions healed and united," Dr. Hutchinson said. "But unless the union takes place at the level of the local congregation, it will mean little, even at the top."
The service ended the first day of the conference. The first business session was held this morning.
The conference will end Sunday when Bishop Edwin Holt Hughes of the Wisconsin area delivers the conference address and reveals the assignment of pastors.

U. S. Testing Group Elects Markwardt

L. J. Markwardt, assistant director of the U. S. Forest Products Laboratory, has been elected vice-president of the American Society for Testing Materials, it was announced in Detroit, Wednesday at the society's annual meeting.
Election to the vice-presidency of the group is tantamount to election as president of the organization, two years from now, for a 1-year term.
The society's principal function is to work toward greater standardization of testing methods for construction materials and designs, including wood, metals, concrete, plastics, and composites.
Markwardt was unable to attend the society's meeting because he now is in Europe for conferences with British, French, Swiss, and other wood research leaders. He was American representative at a United Nations (UN) subcommittee meeting in Geneva, Switzerland, recently to discuss international standards for mechanical testing of wood products.

Broom St. Beach Closed Indefinitely

The Broom st. bathing beach on Lake Monona has been closed for an "indefinite period," Parks Supt. James G. Marshall announced today, because the Law park lake fill has reached that point.
When, if ever, the beach will be reopened depends upon future development of the new shore line, Marshall said.
He cautioned swimmers not to use the beach because it no longer will have lifeguard protection. John Peckham, relief guard temporarily in charge at Broom st., has been transferred.
Beaches nearest to the Broom st. shore, to which swimmers were directed by Marshall, are Brimingham, B. B. Clarke, and Franklin.

CIO Hiring Hall Ruled Violation

Seaman's Act Said Against T-H Law
WASHINGTON (U.P.)—A National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) trial examiner ruled Thursday the CIO National Maritime union violated the Taft-Hartley act by insisting on a union hiring hall in its dealing with four Great Lakes shipping companies.
It was the first ruling by a board agent on the legality of the union hiring hall—the chief issue in the current coast-wise maritime dispute.
The trial examiner, Howard Myers, said the hiring hall clause demanded by the union on the Great Lakes "is clearly repugnant to the (Taft-Hartley) act."
Under the hiring hall system which is used by most maritime unions, the unions supply crews to the ships operators.
Myers accused the union and seven of its top officers of bargaining in bad faith with the four companies. He asked the full five-man labor board to uphold his findings and outlaw the hiring hall on the Great Lakes.
If Myers' ruling is not contested by the parties within 20 days, it automatically will have the effect of a court order.
