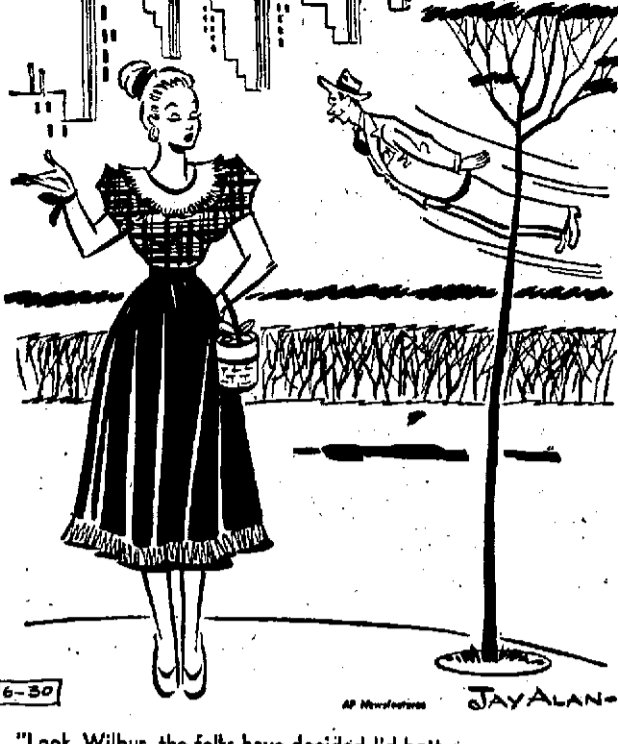

By HASKINS Q. On what occasions is the 21-gun Presidential Salute given by the Army to the President of the United States? H. V. E. A. The Department of the Army says that regulations provide as follows: (a) Salutes and honors rendered the President include a salute of 21 guns on arrival at and departure from an Army post. Ruffles and flourishes (4) and the playing of the national anthem are considered an inseparable part of the salute. (Similar honors are accorded an ex-President, a march being substituted for the national anthem.) (b) When the President aboard any vessel or craft flying the President's flag passes an Army post equipped to fire salutes, the post commander will fire the national salute (21 guns).

These latter terms were actually not used until 1939, when the uranium nucleus was broken into two nearly equal fragments. Q. Did the United States Flag ever have more than 13 stripes? G. B. D. A. After Vermont and Kentucky entered the Union, Congress, on Jan. 13, 1794, altered the flag to consist of 15 stripes and 13 stars. A later law fixed the number of stripes permanently at 13.
