

Q. On what occasions is the 21-gun Presidential Salute given by the Army to the President of the United States? H. V. E. A. The Department of the A. The Department of the Army says that regualtions pro-vide as follows: (a). Salutes and honors rendered the Presi-dent include a salute of 21 guns on arrival at and departure from an Army post. Ruffles and flour-ishes (4) and the playing of the national anthem are considered an inseparable part of the sa-lute. (Similar honors are ac-corded an ex-President, a march corded an ex-President, a march being substituted for the nation-al anthem). (b). When the President aboard any vessel or craft flying the President's flag passes an Army post equipped to fire salutes, the post com-mander will fire the national salute (21 guns).

Q. Is it not a fact that mem-bers of Congress are immune from arrest? O. R. A. Under the Constitution na-

A. Under the Constitution na-tional legislators are immune from arrest except for treason, felony and breach of the peace. In criminal cases members are as liable to arrest as other citi-zens. However, while attending a session and going to and from a session they cannot be arrest-ed on civil process.

Q. Please explain what is meant by uranium fission. M. McC. M. McC. A. In biology when a cell divides to produce two equal cells the process is called fission. By analogy the breaking of the nucleus of an atom into two equal nuclei may be called nu-clear or atomic fission. These latter terms were actually not used until 1939, when the urani-um nucleus was broken into two nearly equal fragments.




