
ON BRIDGE By WILLIAM E. McKENNEY

THE most common mistake made by bridge writers is the presenting of complicated hands. Since Alphonse (Sonny) Moyse Jr. has taken over the publishing of the monthly mag-azine, The Bridge World, it con-

tains interesting articles for the benefit of the average player.

In the May issue there was an article by William Allen Smith Jr. of Huntington, N. Y., who selected a number of hands and pointed out how easy it was to misplay them. Today's hand is taken from that article.

McKENNEY



West won the first trick with the king of hearts and then shifted to the jack of diamonds, which declarer won. He picked which declarer won. He picked up the trumps, and saying to himself that the king and queen of clubs could not both be in the West hand, he played a club from dummy, finessed the tenspot and lost to the queen. Another diamond came back, dummy's king won and another club my's king won, and another club finesse was taken and lost. Thus declarer lost two hearts and two

clubs.
It is quite easy to make this hand. Win the jack of diamonds with the ace, take three rounds of trumps, cash dummy's king of diamonds and ruff a diamond. Then lead the jack of hearts. West will win and exit with a heart, and now you have cleared both the dummy and your own hand of hearts and diamonds. Lead a club from dummy and finesse the ten-spot. West will win and must lead into the acejack of clubs, or give you a sluff and a ruff.

Although this is a simple hand, you will find it worthwhile to study it carefully, as it is an ideal example of stripping out a hand.


