Church Services in Long Beach Slot Machines Grabbed in Raid

LOS ANGELES, July 3. (AP) More than 130 slot machines were in possession of police today following a raid on Automatic Games Co. Samuel Dorin, part owner of the firm, and salesman George Warner were booked yesterday on charges of violating a city ordinance prohibiting the renting of slot machines or other games of chance. Dorin said the firm has been licensed by the city for the two years it has been in business. He said he sells machines to Las Vegas, Nev., gambling houses and rents them as movie props and in private homes. Dorin added that his company advertised in local newspapers.

Journalists Claim Freedom of Speech

SCARBOROUGH, Eng., July 3. (AP) The National Union of Journalists resolved today that no newspaperman should be penalized for expressing political opinions in private life. Delegates told the union's national conference that some newspapers are getting ready to purge Communists from their staffs.

Wife Statistics

LOS ANGELES, July 3. (AP) Statistics released today show that the average woman in California has 1.7 children. The figures are based on a survey of 100,000 families. The average number of children per family is 2.1, but only 1.7 are living. The statistics show that the number of children per family has increased steadily since 1940.

Young Sailor Didn't Go Far

SAN FRANCISCO, July 3. (AP) A 21-year-old veteran thought he was getting away from it all when his 30-foot sloop sailed under the Golden Gate Bridge bound for Hawaii. Milton H. Vannoland of San Francisco was dreaming of a Pacific adventure when he set his home-made craft on course, lashed the sails and tiler, and climbed into his bunk to sleep. Several hours later, he awoke to the sound of lapping waves, his craft had reached 30 miles south of here and filled with water. In disgust, Vannoland gave his sloop to a neighboring farmer and returned home to face the disillusionment of a postwar world.

Draft Law Vague on Mine Seizure

WASHINGTON, July 3. (AP) Government attorneys took a long look at the new draft law today to see whether it gives President Truman the power to seize steel company coal mines if next Tuesday's threatened strike occurs. The steel firms squared away yesterday for what looks like a major tussle with John L. Lewis over his union shop contract with the rest of the soft coal industry. They asked the National Labor Relations Board to seek an injunction against the union shop provision.

DOG'S 'UNFARE' Taxi Man Bans Canine Scrip

ST. PAUL, Minn., July 3. (AP) Emil Barbeau, taxi company owner here, has forbidden his drivers to accept animals in payment for fares in his cabs here. When a woman passenger couldn't pay a taxi charge, one cab pilot accepted two fox terrier pups instead of \$7.85 because, the driver explained: "She said they were high-class dogs."

Guild Defends Red Newsmen

SAN FRANCISCO, July 3. (AP) The American Newspaper Guild (C. I. O.), was under instruction today to go to bat for a member discharged as an admitted Communist. A resolution approved by the convention declared it did not consider such political belief, in the absence of a showing of overt misfeasance, "constitutes just and sufficient grounds for discharge" of a newspaperman.
