West returned the queen of hearts, Rapee won, cashed the ace of clubs and ruffed the small club in dummy with the

four of spades. His next play was a diamond to the ace, then a small dia-mond was returned, won in dummy with the queen and the king of diamonds cashed, on which Rapee discarded his last club. Then a small heart was ruffed.


