Hillsdale School District 'Write-Off' Asked by Patrons

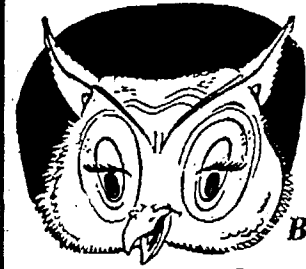
RICHLAND CENTER—Patrons of the Hillsdale school on Ash Creek having petitioned the Richland county school committee to abolish the district, the committee has attached the farm lands to three adjoining districts. The voters were given the privilege of naming the district to which they wished to be attached, and the Hoosier Hollow, Pauls and Elm Grove schools were named. County Supt. Earl L. Anderson pointed out that the procedure in abolishing a school district in this county is to hold special meetings in the district where the voters

talk over the matter and decide what step they wish taken. If it is to abolish the district, the county school committee is petitioned, and that body acts after hearing the wishes of the people in regard to attachment to another district. Two other districts, Marshall and Hickory Ridge, have recently been abolished.

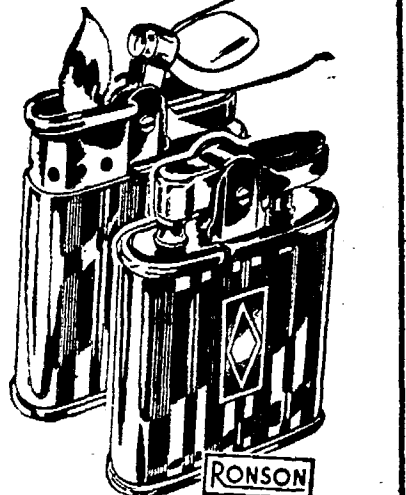

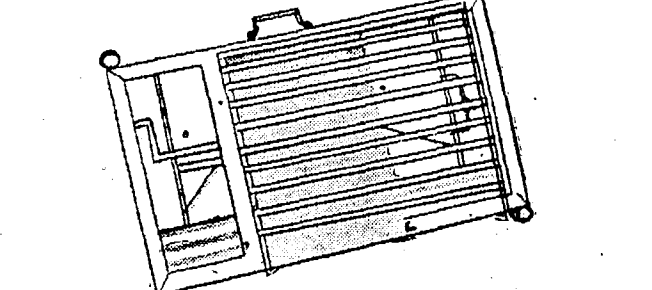
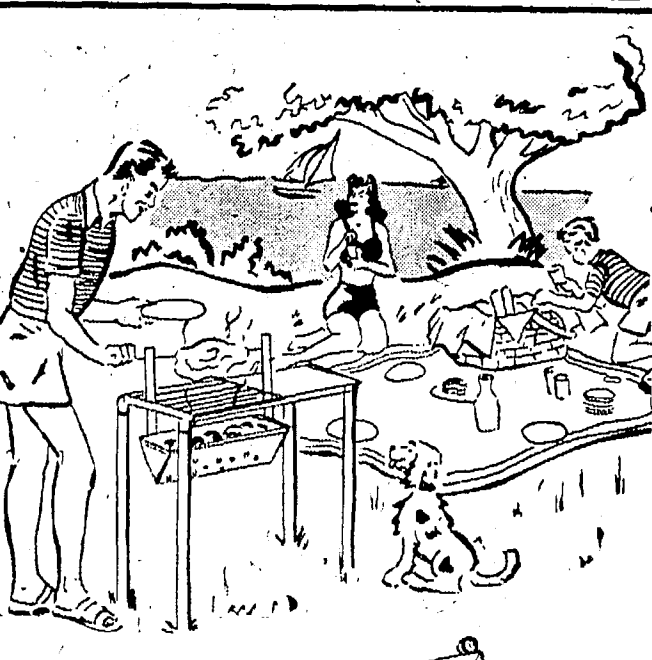
