Street station to 91st Street and return, a distance of twenty miles, using lumps of powdered milk as fuel instead of coal. The run was made at the request of Dr. Herman N. Bundeson, health commissioner Bundeson, health commissioner of Chicago, who wished to emphasize and advertise his axiom, 'Milk is to the human body as fuel is to the locomotive,' which he used in his campaign to educate children regarding the value of milk. The locomotive was first fired with coal but fire was maintained throughout the run with briquets of dried milk made especially for the occasion."

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

After winning the ace of spades, you must cash four heart tricks. On the fourth heart East is helpless. If he trumps, you over-trump. If he does not trump, you throw a club away from dummy.

Now you lead a spade, and East has to call it a day, according to Fishbein. He might as well go up with the queen of spades. Now he leads a club which West wins. If West comes hack with another club, declarer is going to get a sluff and a ruff. West's best defense, says Fishbein, is to underlead the ace of diamonds. North has no other play than to go up with the king.

A well-played hand!


