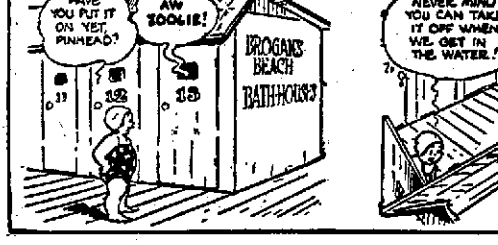

ANSWER TO QUESTION NO. 1

Yes, Psychologist L. M. Terman, in his famous study of 1000 gifted children (IQs 140 and higher) had their teachers rate several hundred on "conscientiousness." The gifted boys rated 4.8, the girls 4.0. The unselected average boys rated 6.2, girls 5.4. The smaller the number, the higher the rating.

ANSWER TO QUESTION NO. 2

Not time, but learning new things that bury the old. Elaborate experiments by psychologists Minami and Dalenbach with cockroaches showed that getting is due chiefly (possibly entirely) to the blotting out of what we learn by new impressions. Their animals remembered almost perfectly and indefinitely if kept in a state of practically complete rest, so they could not learn anything new to bury the old. Other experiments indicate this is just as true of human beings.

ANSWER TO QUESTION NO. 3

Yes, they did pretty well in World War I, better in World War II and will be more successful from now on. Psychologists H. Feldman and A. A. Malicki gave a test to 50 AWOL's and 50 non-AWOL's on such things as having been fired from jobs, being over-protected or rejected by parents, ambition, truancy, church attendance, drinking, sex relationships, etc. The test, if given at induction, would have separated them with about 80 or 90 per cent success.

NEW ATTITUDE

IF THE REPUBLICANS take charge of the administration next year, as they fondly hope, there will be no clean sweep of the New Deal legislation of the last 16 years. There will be important changes—improvements in administration, changes in laws that have shown themselves defective, new legislation to meet new conditions in a changing world, a generally new attitude toward the problem of business and taxation, and a maturing and stabilizing of foreign policy.—Kansas City Star.
