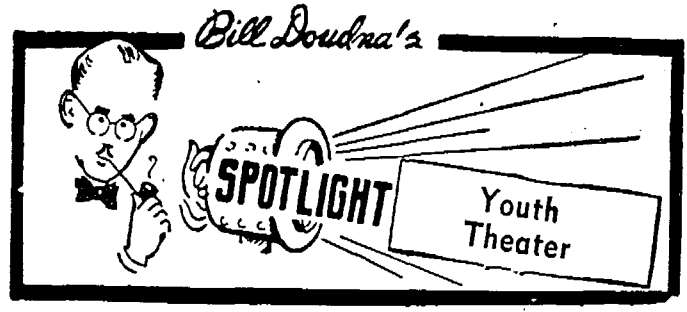


New Tune for Spike Now
