By WILLAM E. MCKENNEY DO YOU AND your bridge-play-ing friends like to argue over a proper bid or discard? If, you do, you will like today's hand, which caused a great deal of argument at the Mayfair Bridge Club in New York. First of all, we will look at the bidding. West bid one heart, and North made a very light double. Actually he had no values for the double. East jumped to three hearts and South went to four spades. Should West have doubled? He certainly felt that he would make a spade trick, a heart and

active a spade trick, a heart and a club, and his partner had given him a tremendous jump. Some of the boys at the club pointed out that West had no pointed out that West had no right to figure on a heart trick in view of the big jump by East. But others argued that if that were true, West ought to get two club tricks. No, said the first group, North had dou-bled and, therefore, North must have some strength. So the ar-gument went on as to whether or not West's double was good or bad. In the play West opened the

In the play West opened the small diamond and dummy's

king won. The queen of spades was led and declarer went up with the ace, returned a low spade and West won with the

spade and West won with the king. Now the question was, what should East discard? Should he discard the deuce of hearts? It was agreed that if East had held the king of hearts, his proper discard would have been the seven of hearts. Actually, however, East discarded the five of clubs, and West, reading this of clubs, and West, reading this as a small club, did not lead a club


West decided that the discard of the small club confirmed that East held the king of hearts, so at this point he underled his ace of hearts, allowing South to win of hearts, allowing South to win the trick with the king. Then South made the whole hand. It was argued that West should have read the discard of the five of clubs as a high club, especially with dummy holding the nine-eight seven. The West player in the case said that if East had discarded the deuce of hearts he would have played a hearts, he would have played a club, although it is doubtful that a doubler would lead away from the acc-queen. If he had read the five of clubs as a come-on card, he could have led a club safely. East would have re-turned a heart, and the contract would have been defeated.


