Minister Turns Quiz Award Over to Relief

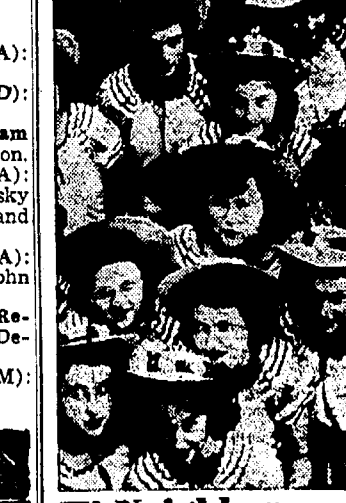

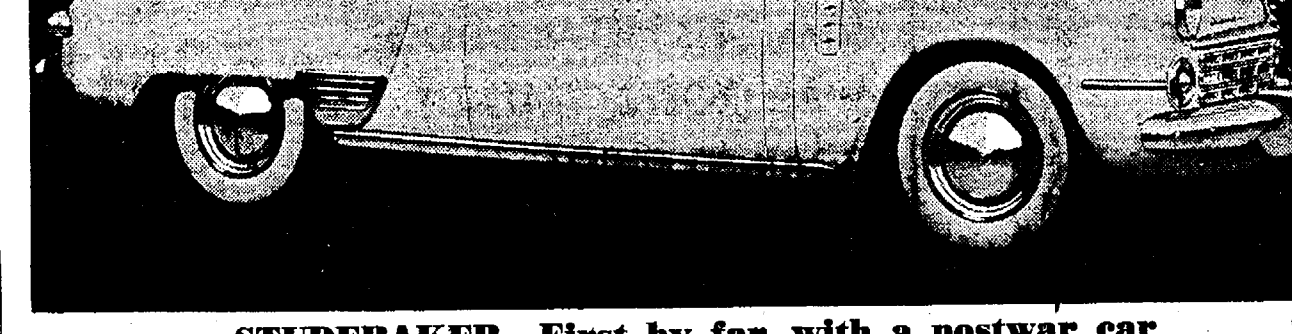
