Q. What is the greatest age to which people have lived in the United States? J. McN.

A. Since accurate records are not available it is impossible to make a definite statement. Publicity has been given to the case of Noah Raby who died in 1904 at Piscatawny Alms House, J., at the reputed age of 132. Other famous cases were those of Mrs. Sarah Bosworth Brad-way of Eastford, Conn., said to have been 107 in 1925, and John A. Stewart, a banker of New York, who was 103 in 1925. One difficulty in checking figures of this kind is that many aged people lived in places where birth registration records were not required at the time of their birth.

Q. Did the Soviet Union use U. S. tanks or Russian tanks during the battle of Stalingrad?

A. The Department of the Army says that there is no record that the Soviets used U. S. tanks on any significant scale during the battle of Stalingrad. At no time did U. S. tanks constitute a majority of the armored vehicles used by the So-viets in a major operation in-volving armor. It is quite pos-sible that the Soviets employed some U.S. tanks during the pur-suit phase following the battle around Stalingrad itself.

Q. Under what circumstances did Henry Clay say that he would rather be right than President? N. M.

A. When told that his advocacy of the Missouri Compromise measure of 1850 would injure his chances for the Presidency, Henry Clay remarked to Preston of Kentucky, "I would rather be right than President."

Q. Is the watermelon native to the United States? B. V. E.

A. The watermelon is a sepa rate and distinct species of the cucumber family which has been grown in this country for a great many years, but which is supposed to have originated in a wild state in Africa.



He had wanted to know what poker hand is often called "The Washington Monument." 
