Pickling

TOMATO SOUP—CANNED

1 pk. tomatoes 2 bunches celery 6 onions 2 green peppers

1 cup sugar 1/4 cup salt 1/2 cup melted butter 1 cup flour

Boil tomatoes 10 minutes. Drain. Add celery, onions, and peppers, ground. Boil 15 minutes. Combine sugar, salt, butter, and flour. Add to mixture. Boil again 10 to 15 minutes. Put in sterile jars, and seal.

DELICIOUS PEPPER RELISH

I pint each of ground green peppers, ground sweet red peppers, and ground onions.

1 tsp. salt 1 cup sugar 11/2 cups vinegar and water

Cover ground vegetables with boiling water and let stand 10 minutes and drain. Cover with fresh boiling water, let stand 5 minutes and drain. Add sugar, salt, and vinegar. Cook 15 minutes. Seal in hot sterilized jars. Makes 1½ quarts.

PICKELED PEACHES

4 cups brown or granulated sugar gups water 2 cups vinegar

Peaches Two 3-inch sticks 10 whole cloves

Peel peaches quickly by dropping into boiling water for a few minutes. Tie spices in a muslin bag. Cook sugar, water, and vinegar together with spices till boiling. Add enough peaches to fill a quart jar at one time and boil 5 minutes. Put in jars and Cook sugar, water, and fill with boiling syrup. Spices tend to darken fruit if canned with It over the winter season.

CANNED SWEET RED OR GREEN PEPPERS

Cut peppers into quarters or large strips removing seeds and stem. Pour boiling water over to cover and let stand 3 minutes. Drain. Plunge into cold water for 1 minute. Drain. Pack in jars. Make a syrup of 2 cups vinegar, 2 cups water, 2 cups sugar. Boil this for 5 minutes. Pour over peppers in jars and seal.

WATERMELON RIND PICKLES

2 lbs. watermelon rind 2 lbs. sugar 1 pt. vinegar

Seal in clean, hot jars.

1 tsp. cloves 1 thsp. cinnamon I tsp. allspice I lemon, sliced thin

1 pt. water Soak the watermelon rind over night in salt brine (1/4 cup salt to 1 quart of water). Drain, Cook rind in clear water until tender. Make hot pickling solution of other ingredients, add drained rind, and boil rapidly until clear. The spices (except lemon) should be tied in a small bag and removed before the pickle is bottled.

11/2 cups mild vinegar I cup water
