Canning and Pickling RECIPES

TOMATO SOUP—CANNED
1 pk. tomatoes
2 bunches celery
6 onions
2 green peppers
1 cup sugar
1/4 cup salt
1/2 cup melted butter
1 cup flour

DELICIOUS PEPPER RELISH
1 pint each of ground green peppers, ground sweet red peppers, and ground onions.
1 tsp. salt
1 cup sugar
1 1/2 cups vinegar and water

PICKLED PEACHES
4 cups brown or granulated sugar
2 cups water
2 cups vinegar
Peaches
Two 3-inch sticks cinnamon
10 whole cloves

CANNED SWEET RED OR GREEN PEPPERS
Cut peppers into quarters or large strips removing seeds and stem. Pour boiling water over to cover and let stand 3 minutes. Drain. Plunge into cold water for 1 minute. Drain. Pack in jars. Make a syrup of 2 cups vinegar, 2 cups water, 2 cups sugar. Boil this for 5 minutes. Pour over peppers in jars and seal.

WATERMELON RIND PICKLES
2 lbs. watermelon rind
2 lbs. sugar
1 pt. vinegar
1 tsp. cloves
1 tsp. cinnamon
1 tsp. allspice
1 lemon, sliced thin

PICKLED BEETS
1 1/2 cups mild vinegar
1 cup water
1/4 cup sugar
1/2 tsp. pickling spices
Cooked, sliced, chopped or whole, hot beets
Pour hot pickling mixture over beets. Seal immediately.
