Passing Show

In one of the most comprehensive
promotions of its kind, Paramount
studio recently completed arrange-
ments with Sears, Roebuck & Co.,
whereby four forthcoming top re-
leases will be "pre-sold" nationally
and locally through tieups with
the entire nationwide store chain.
The huge promotion will focus
attention on "Night Has a Thou-
sand Eyes," "Sealed Verdict," "The
Tatlock Millions" and the Techni-
color film "The Paleface," both on
a national and local level. The
pictures will be exploited through
nationalwide amateur "snapshot
contests" to be conducted by the
Sears chain from Oct. 1 to Nov. 15
in which prize-winning photos are
to awarded at least \$10,000 in cash
and several thousand dollars in
photo equipment. Local prize-win-
ners will be eligible for \$1,000 in
cash in national grand awards.
Six nationally known judges will
decide the contest. They comprise
the directors of photography of the
four Paramount pictures exploit-
ed through the tieup, including
John F. Seitz, "Night Has a Thou-
sand Eyes"; Leo Tover, "Sealed
Verdict"; Charles B. Lang, Jr.,
"The Tatlock Millions"; Ray Ren-
nahan, "The Paleface"; and A. L.
"Whitey" Schafer, director of
Paramount studio still photogra-
phy, and Frank Fenner, Jr., edi-
tor, "Popular Photography" maga-
zine.
Sears stores will build window
and interior displays featuring
scene stills from the four Para-
mount films, and displays will be
tied in with the local theaters play-
ing the pictures, and the playdate.
