## Governor Proclaims Labor Day, Points to State's Record

In a Labor Day proclamation Friday, Gov. Rennebohm paid tribute to labor as "an integral, vital, and essential part of our American economy."

In designating Monday, Sept. 6 as Labor Day, the governor cited "constructive new unemployment compensation legislation during its centennial year has found itself notably free from labor disturbances while accomplishing constructive results."

The governor pointed out that "as a state have made substantial progress in development of plans that will eliminate loss of income because of accidents and sickness."

Gov. Rennebohm praised close cooperation of both labor and management in aiding in passing constructive new unemployment compensation legislation.

Tugwell Drops Title in Wallace Party WILSON, N. Y. (U.P.)—Rexford Guy Tugwell, prominent member of the Roosevelt administration during the New Deal days, said today he was no longer an official of the Progressive party led by Henry A. Wallace.

Tugwell, who was national co-chairman of the Wallace-for-President committee, said at his summer home here that he still was a member of the party but had no official role since the convention, where he served as chairman of the platform committee.

Tugwell would not comment on his political intentions in the future, but said he would make a statement when he decided upon what course he would follow.

## Small Claims Court Had 245 Actions in July

There were 245 actions started in the Dane county small claims court during July and 191 were disposed of, Judge Douglas Nelson said today.

Of the total, four are being held open to await completion of settlement arrangements and the remaining 54 scheduled for hearing in August.

Actions commenced during the month were for amounts ranging from \$2.80 to \$200.

Forty-six of the actions were for the recovery of accounts claimed to be due for personal services; 169 for recovery of monies claimed due on other accounts; five were actions involving accidents; eight related to eviction proceedings; four were replevin actions, and 13 were termed "miscellaneous."

PARIS—Madison women who have not gone all out for the "new look" will be interested to know that the previews of the fall fashions now showing in Paris indicate shorter hemlines and slimmer skirts.

This is perhaps due to the fact that most women the world over and especially the women in Paris have not been able to afford to dress in this year's extreme fashions which demanded complicated designs and great amounts of dress materials in each outfit.

Should Reflect Life Or, as Marcel Rochas, Parisien designer, says, "One is too apt to forget that glorifying woman is a goal and not a means for spectacular fashion. Style should reflect life and not theater."

Rochas' models are showing simple lines with hemlines 10 to 12 inches from the floor. His coats stress full, swing backs with inverted pleats. Two-piece suits are worn without blouses so that they replace a dress.

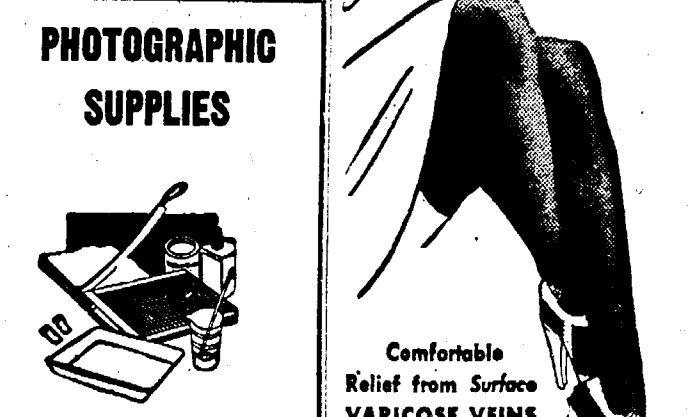
