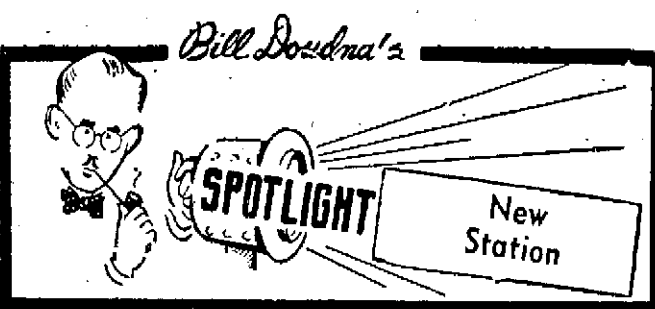

PLOT: Charles Boyer, refugee (doctor from Austria in pre-invasion Paris without a passport, meets another refugee, Ingrid Bergman, whose desire for love and security cause her to lead a somewhat dubious life. They fall in love. A German Gestapo man, Charles Laughton, whose inhuman treatment of Boyer when he was in a German concentration camp almost ruined Boyer's life, appears in Paris. Boyer plots to kill him. The film shows the plight of refugees in general who are caught in a whirlpool of international hatred.

HIGH SPOTS: Scenes in Bergman's lush apartment, provided by a rival lover. In a small room, Bergman and Boyer discover they are in love. Boyer and Laughton meet, and Laughton thinking Boyer another loyal German, makes a date to see Paris nightlife.

LOW SPOTS: Unreality of Bergman and Boyer's initial meeting. Ditto, when Boyer comes to the aid of Bergman, shot by her other lover. VERDICT: Very good.
