Reactions Caused By Penicillin

BY H. N. BUDESEN, M. D. OF late, as the use of penicillin has become more general, all of us have heard a good deal about the bad reactions which seem to develop every now and then in certain patients.

Safest Preparation From their use of penicillin in treatment of syphilis in this great number of patients, Dr. Evan W. Thomas and his co-workers concluded that it is the safest preparation yet discovered for use against this disease.

The occurrence of hives does not mean that the treatment with penicillin must be permanently discontinued. Sometimes it may be necessary to stop it for about 10 days; at the end of this time it may be resumed.

Symptoms of Disease It was also noted that in certain patients with syphilis, some symptoms of the disease itself seemed to become worse when the penicillin treatment was given. However, this only lasted for a short time.
