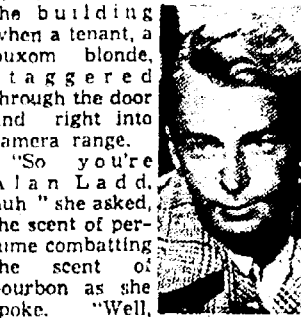

HOLLYWOOD—When we were in Chicago shooting "One Woman" a few weeks ago, the cameras were trained on the entrance to a cheap rooming house...

But our first stop was Minneapolis where I was at the annual Aquatennial. Now, I'm no performer—I don't sing or hoof, and I couldn't quite figure what I'd do to entertain the folks.

The Aquatennial is the best public relations gimmick any town could want—and the most dazzling show I've ever seen. Over 600,000 people lined the parade route opening day, although the city's population is only 500,000.

Before continuing on to Chicago, Sue and I crammed in two days' fishing at Gull Lake. We caught two well-eyed pike and thought we would send them home to Los Angeles until I figured out the cost.

In fact, crowds were so great we had to set up decoy shots to attract the crowds while we made the actual scene a few blocks away. On one such occasion an assistant director and I dashed into a nearby taxi and told the driver to step on it.

In Chicago, the "One Woman" crew used disguised cameras so as not to attract crowds while we were shooting in the streets. We hid the cameras in packing-cases and innocent looking trucks—but we fooled no one.
