The clinic will be devoted to discussions of the government flight training program in the state and current aviation problems.

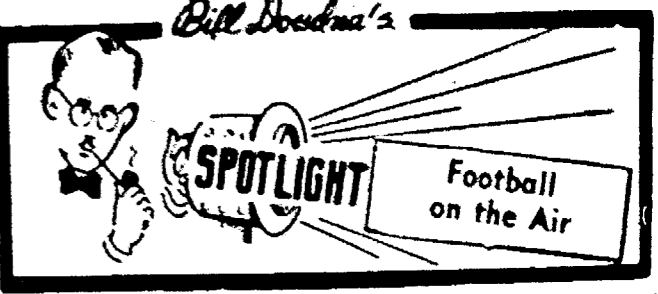
