W. H. L. The Mount Vernon Ladies' Association of the Union says that the mansion and the adja-cent subsidiary buildings are repainted about every five years. Two coats are applied. The sid-ing of the mansion and portions of the siding of a number of the other buildings are bevelled to resemble blocks of stone. These surfaces originally received a sand linish which was applied by blowing or throwing sand upon the freshly painted surfaces. In accordance with restoration policy this same practice is fol-lowed in present-day repainting.

Q. What is the procedure in redeeming Government G bonds?

A. Government G bonds may be redeemed only through Fed-eral Reserve Banks or the U.S. Treasury. The bonds must be at least six months old before re-demption. If the bonds are held for the entire twelve years the interest rate amounts to 2½ per cent, which is paid semi-annually. When the bonds are sold before the expiration of twelve years an adjustment is made for the interest.




