**INJUNCTION WILL STAND IN TEXAS VOTE DISPUTE**

HOUSTON, Tex., Sept. 24 (AP)—Federal Circuit Judge J. C. Hutcheson, Jr., tonight held he has no authority to stay execution of an injunction which prevents Lyndon Johnson, name being placed on the November election ballot as the Texas Democratic U. S. senatorial nominee.

Coke Stevenson, Johnson's opponent in the state's Aug. 28 second Democratic primary, obtained the injunction in a federal district court.

Judge Hutcheson said the full U. S. fifth circuit court of appeals will hear Johnson's appeal from the injunction in Atlanta, Ga., Oct. 4.

After Hutcheson's formal ruling, attorneys for Johnson said they did not know immediately what their next step will be.

They said they have either two courses:

1. They can go to the United States supreme court in Washington.
2. They can try to obtain a litigated writ of prohibition, putting their argument on paper and sending copies around to individual members of the five man court of appeals for a decision.
