

Rapes said that although Meyer has never played in tournaments, he has, nevertheless, picked up the knack of instantaneous, daring decision that marks a fine play-

trump contract. Declarer played the ten from dummy, and the natural play for Meyer was to win the trick with the queen. However, he took a quick count. He knew that declarer had four club tricks. South had bid a diamond and with the queenten in his own hand. Meyer felt sure that declarer had four dia-mond tricks. He probably held the ace of hearts, which made nine tricks.

In rubber bridge it does not make much difference whether or not an extra trick is lost. The bject of defensive play is to defeat the contract. So Meyer played the ace of spades on the first trick and immediately re-turned the king of hearts. Declarer held off until the

third round, and now he knew that he would have to guess the diamond situation — but why bother to guess the diamond when he had located the queen of spades? East would not have won the first spade trick with ace if he held the queen. So South led a spade and when West played low, he put on dummy's tack: Meyer won with the queen and cashed his other heart trick, defeating the con-




