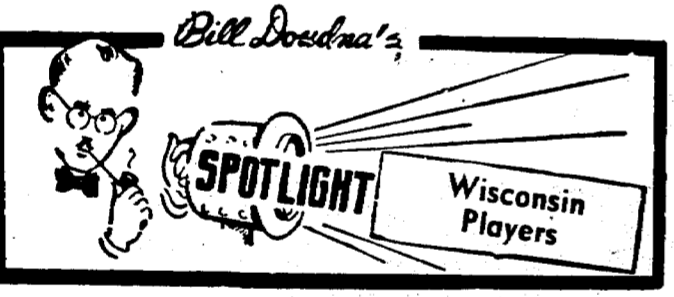

The student actors, under Fredrick A. Buerki's direction, brought most of the show's laughs into hearing but missed some by failure to apply pressure at certain moments. This was particularly true in the first act, when it appeared they hadn't quite decided whether they should play the comedy as broad burlesque or as satire. Eventually they hit a middle ground, which was the proper place.
