All the 9,200 tickets have been sold. "Our only regret," says Ray L. Hilsenrath, student financial adviser, "is that we do not have more seats available."

Among Waring's artists will be Leonard Kravendok, baritone, who was regular performer at WHBL, Sheboygan, before he went to New York to study and, eventually, to join Waring. The tentative program includes his singing of "My Journey's End."

Waring favorites on the tentative schedule include "The Nutcracker Suite" in Harry Simeone's gleeful orchestra arrangement; "Fiddle Faddle," "Dry Bones," "My Hero," Uncle Lumpy Brannum's Hawaiian travelog, "The Lord's Prayer" (sung by Stuart Churchill), and the Gearhart-Morley two-plant playing of "The Blue Danube."
