Catholic Editor to Lecture Here



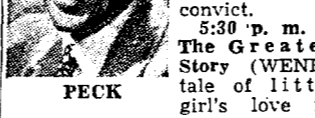

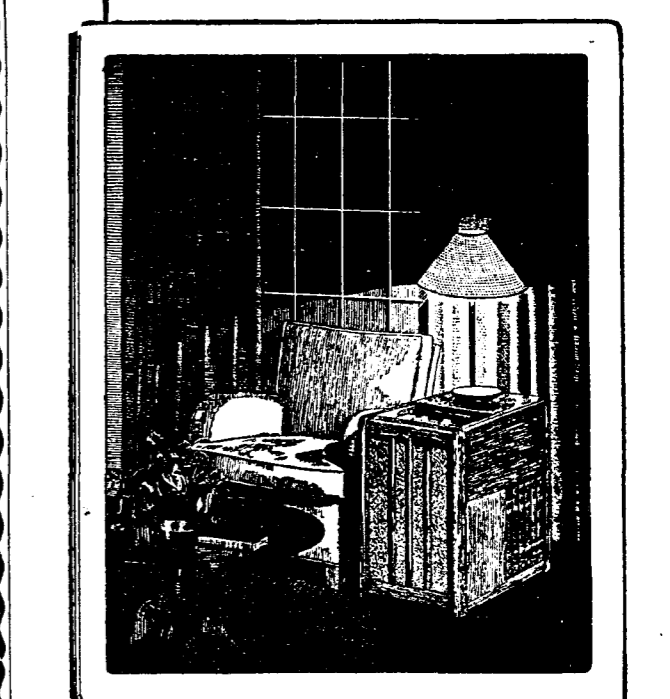
