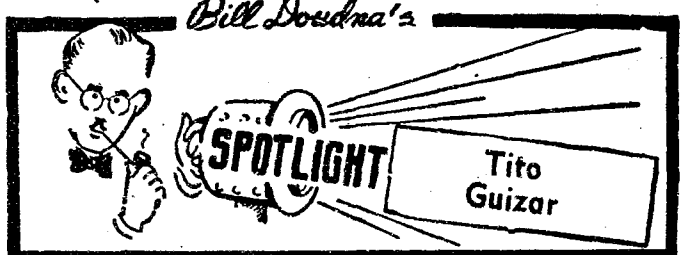

Tito Guizar and his Singing Mariachis were advertised for the Parkway theater Tuesday night, but Blackstone the Magician must have been around somewhere, too, because a great vanishing and transformation act had taken place.

Guizar and his guitar were there, but the Singing Mariachis had disappeared. They weren't even on the printed program listed.

Instead, the company consisted of Guizar, a personable, engaging singer whose guitar-playing was even better than his vocalizing.

Things got so badly disarranged about a quarter of a way through the evening that Guizar figuratively threw the program into a backstage wastebasket and just took over.

The audience loved it. It was a small group on this side of the footlights, but it liked Guizar, his singing, and his guitar playing, which was something to hear and watch.

A fine showman, Guizar sprinkled humor and north-of-the-border songs through his performance, took the audience into his confidence about what he liked to sing, and answered many requests for tunes.

Miss Fonseca opened the program with emotionless, often off-pitch singing, and appeared once or twice later.
