

An intensely introspective piece of music had its first performance in Madison Sunday night, and the small audience in Music hall greeted its composer and its play-

The work was Cecil Burleigh's "String Quartet No. 2—Transition." It was a part of the Prolater Australia and the Prolater Austral Arte quartet's second centennialyear concert.
In "Transition," the University

of Wisconsin composer-teacher reports an internal struggle, but in such a way that it reflects his own personal dignity. Its approach is the "modern" one, but it is easier

other and the transition through which one passes before experiencing stabilizing convictions."

The quartet opens with this turbulence predominant in both the tempo and the harmonies. It achieves, at last, a sort of serenity but the total satisfaction, one

—but not a total satisfaction; one feels that Burleigh is telling him that, while the composer has found release from disquiet, he is still searching, still growing. There is a constant forward movement in the work; it is never static, but, on the other hand, i is never merely restless. And i

does not overemphasize its statements through the repetitions which many younger "moderns" utilize. Too, there is coherence in the scoring which doesn't give the impression—as much new music does—that one of the perform-ers could get lost and the audience would never know it.

The musicians opened their program with a spirited playing of Haydn's G-major quartet, and closed it with a work which, at its first performance more than a century ago, aroused controversy. It was Beethoven's seventh quar-tet, the first of the "Rasumovsky" series written for a Russian prince who was a great and knowing patron of music, painting, and sculpture. Protests brought from the com-
