



nevertheless delivered with understanding and grace. And Hageman's "Miranda" was a joy from every point of view.

The soprano sang Debussy's "C'Est l'Extase Langoureuse" with the same gracefulness, and arias by Mozart, Rossini, and Massenet with great skill—particularly the Mozart choice. But again the small timbre of her voice at climatic high notes detracted from the final effect.

In such lyric numbers as Respighi's "Nebbie" and Browning's "The Philanderer." and in the rhythmic "Sin Tu Amor" of Sandoval, she gave the most pleasure. Miss Quartararo emphasized her exquisite control in the over worked Handelian pastiche, "Old Mother Hubbard." "Nebbie" replaced "Canto di Primavera" on the program because of a St. Louis incident. Miss Quartararo was there last week to appear with Martial Singher in an orchestral concert. The latter was ill, so she substituted planoaccompanied songs for a scheduled duet. When her accompanist, Laura Forde Giere, returned to the stage for the music, the hard-
